- It's not too early to start thinking about the Fall Ordeal. If you know Scouts and Scouters who were unable to attend the Ordeal last April, they are eligible to participate in the Ordeal to be held September 27 – 29, at Boulder Creek Scout Reservation.
- Philmont Order of the Arrow Trail Crew and Northern Tier Canoe Base applications are still available on the national OA website: http://www.oabsa.org/. Both programs allow arrowmen ages 16 – 21 to enjoy our national high adventure bases for two weeks. The first week is spent in service, building hiking or portage trails. The second week allows participants to enjoy the full range of activities provided by Philmont or the Northern Tier wilderness. Cost for both programs is only \$100, not including travel.
