As the sun started to rise on the morning of May 27th, a small contingent of Ohlone Arrowmen entered the hallowed grounds of Golden Gate National Cemetery to start preparing for an invasion.

This invasion was not one of hostility, but one of humility. More than one thousand Scouts from Pacific Skyline Council and adult volunteers descended on this small outpost of military heroes to place an American flag in front of every headstone and marker as a way of saying thank you for giving us the freedoms we enjoy today.

Ohlone members assisted the cemetery personnel in traffic control, flag distribution, cemetery plot assignments, registration sign in, distribution of the



ground pokers, opening ceremonies, food and beverage distribution as well as placing flags in every section of the cemetery.

The grave decoration officially opened about 8:30 AM with the presentation of the colors escorted by personnel representing the various branches of the military. By 11:30 AM, the entire cemetery was fluttering in Red, White and Blue flags and another Memorial Day was about to be ushered in.

Ohlone registered over 3,100 man hours for Service to America and our lodge contributed over 200 hours to this great cause.

There is no better way to say thank you to those who gave so much as to take those few hours on Memorial Day to place a flag on their grave. For all of those Arrowmen who chose to be there, I could feel all of those who we honored saying thank you in return.

Lodge Officer Elections

At the June Lodge meeting, the annual elections of lodge officers was held. During the evening, Michael Maxwell was elected Lodge Chief for the year 2000/2001 program year. Trail to Brotherhood

To become an *Ordeal* member in the "Order," you were elected by your fellow Scouts. Then you chose to complete the *Ordeal* for membership and hopefully began a personal journey of discovery. Using the "legend" as example and the ceremonial characters as a guide you began to understand the this group of honored campers is also a service organization. An organization formed to promote camping, give service to the council and its camps, and to provide leadership opportunities in addition to Scouting units.

What makes the *Brotherhood* honor of the "OA" special is that it is a personal choice. The completion of Brotherhood requirements (see Page 4) and the sending of the required letter to the lodge secretary is the personal choice of each member. The completion of the requirements is all that is needed to be eligible for attending the ceremony and the attainment of the Brotherhood honor.

A Commitment To Serve

Attaining the *Brotherhood* honor is also a commitment to serve Ohlone Lodge. To help make it grow. To help it become a better organization in its effort to serve the Pacific Skyline Council and its units. Many members are needed to produce *News From The Otter*. *Side.* Likewise the *Where To Go Camping* booklet needs to be reviewed, researched, and updated. Regalia needs to be made and maintained for ceremonies and the Indian Dance Team. The Dance Team itself needs dancers, singers, and drummers.

Ordeal Weekend

Strangely enough, the next opportunity to complete the attainment of the *Brotherhood* honor is at the next induction of new members. The *Ordeal* weekend in September needs Elangomats to lead the clans of new members into the Order. Also we need participants in the work crews that complete projects to make our camps a better place and ceremonial members and assistants to provide the inspiration and understanding. New Brotherhood Members In 2000

Every December is recharter time. Not just for Scouting units but also for each of the OA lodges. A part of this rechartering is the annual completion of the Lodge Achievement Program (LAP). This program asks that the lodge completes certain requirements for the attainment of Honor Lodge. One of the needs of Ohlone lodge is the conversion of 30% of its Ordeal membership to the Brotherhood Honor. Based on the last rechartering figures that would mean that at least 40 of our brothers is need to make the commitment to Brotherhood during the 2000 calendar year. Ohlone Lodge has many needs. On its committees as well as our support of the W3A Section Conclave. Not only do we need Scouts to make the commitment but in order to make the goal of *Brotherhood* conversion we also need many of our adult Scouters.

There will be Brotherhood ceremonies held at each of the Ordeals in during the year, fellowship weekend in November and the W3A Section Conclave in September. We really do need your help, but only you can make the choice to meet the requirements and make the commitment.

Fall Ordeal 2000

The Fall Ordeal will take place between September 22nd and 24th at Cutter Scout Reservation. Be at Cutter at 7:00 PM, and bring \$15.00 for food and lodging. The main purpose of an Ordeal is to induct new members into our lodge. One other purpose of an Ordeal is Brotherhood inductions.

If you are planning to go for your Brotherhood induction at this Ordeal, you need to make sure that you meet the requirements for earning the Brotherhood honor.

The Ordeal is all about inducting brand new members into the Lodge, and as such we will need a lot of help from Elangomats and other experienced Arrowman.

This Ordeal is going to be great fun. You can help the lodge by becoming an Elangomat or by just showing up and helping out with various activities.

The Challenges of Brotherhood Membership

You must meet five challenges before you can enter the Circle of the Brotherhood. The first of these you should meet now. The next three require steady effort over a period of months. The last challenge you must meet after you are satisfied that you are meeting the first four.

- 1. *Memorize the signs of Arrow membership.* Memorize the Obligation of the Order, which you received from Allowat Sakima (printed on the back of your membership card and in your handbook). Also, memorize the Order of the Arrow Official Song, the Admonition, the sign of Ordeal membership, and the Arrow handclasp.
- 2. Advance in you understanding of the Ordeal. Gain a thorough understanding of the Ordeal through which you have passed.
- 3. *Serve your unit.* Retain your registration in Scouting. During a period of at least 10 months, strive to fulfill your Obligation by continuing and expanding your service to your own troop or team.
- 4. *Plan for service in your lodge.* Retain your registration in your Order of the Arrow lodge and keep your dues paid. Be aware that acceptance of Brotherhood membership involves a pledge of service to the lodge. Develop a concrete idea of how you plan to fulfill this pledge.
- 5. *Review your progress.* When you earnestly feel that you have met the four challenges above, write a letter to your lodge secretary. In this letter:
 - Explain what you think the Obligation means.
 - Describe how you have been fulfilling this Obligation in your troop or team and in your daily life, and how you have used your understanding of the Ordeal to aid in this service.
 - Describe your specific plans for giving service in the lodge program.

Include with this letter your advance registration application and fees for the next Brotherhood ceremony according to the instruction given by the lodge. The Otter Side, Third Quarter 2000


