The 2003-2004 scouting year offers so much more for Ohlone Lodge and Pacific Skyline Council as a whole then ever before. What do I mean you ask, well new events, new programs, and exciting opportunities await every arrowman who is willing to step up to the challenge.

ORDEALS – this is an amazing opportunity for those scouts that are already in the OA to serve your council camps and guide those other scouts who have not yet become arrowmen. Whether you are serving as an elangomat to help those candidates grow and learn, or as a member of our amazing ceremony team creating colorful stories for those arrowmen to see.

MINICLAVE – a NEW event at Camp Cutter featuring training, competitive events, shows and ceremonies. This will be a first for Ohlone to create and host an event of this type, magnitude, and of this much amount of fun. But it will only work if you want to have fun, because that's all you will be doing when you get there - have fun

SCOUTREACH – an amazing opportunity for all scouts to participate which solidifies the core values of the Order of the Arrow, "service to others". The Scoutreach Mentorship Award, can be earned by participating in the council's Scoutreach program, helping scouts throughout the council that usually would not have the opportunity to be a scout.

The only way you will be allowed to gain the full advantage of learning, excitement, and having fun is if you participate. Village Assistance Program – Goal Setting

Setting goals is the key to your success as a village leader, for these goals will be the foundation upon which you will be able to measure whether you have accomplished what you have set your mind to doing. Together with the rest of your village's leadership and/or membership, brainstorm some ideas of what you would like to accomplish. These ideas can consist of anything. Here are some example topics to get you started: Ceremonies participation, unit election training, service to the district, innovative and fun activities, service opportunities, and scoutmaster appreciation.

Once you have a good list of brainstormed topics, begin to formulate those ideas into Specific Measurable Attainable Realistic Tangible Goals, or S.M.A.R.T. Goals (see http://www.topachievement.com/smart.html for more information on S.M.A.R.T. Goals). Create three short-term goals with a target completion date of three months from now. Create three mid-term goals with a target completion date of six months from now. Finally, create three long-term goals and set a target completion date for each of them. The long-term goals should ultimately take a year or longer to accomplish.

Make your goals well known. Share them with your village at all meetings and activities and do a status check to evaluate the progress being made toward the goals. Find ways to involve everyone in your village to help achieve the goals so that everyone will feel some sense of satisfaction when the goal has been completed. As you approach the target dates for each of the goals, do a formal evaluation to find out if you have stayed on track or to find out what needs to be done to get back on track.


