


## Leadership Positions Available

# Patch Design Competition



## **Unit Visitations**

Arrowmen love to visit units to conduct Unit Elections and promote our council camps. Senior Patrol Leaders, OA Troop Representatives, or Scoutmasters (or corresponding roles from Crews and Ships) may request an Arrowman here: <u>https://goo.gl/forms/43cYfHbyKoAqkk2r2</u>

For those units who would like to participate, the attendance of an Arrowman from outside your Troop is required to ensure a valid election.

In advance of the visitation, members of the Unit (Troop, Crew, Ship) must prepare ballots with the names of the Scouts who meet the eligibility criteria as described below. The attending Arrowman will bring pencils and summary report forms. Beginning February 1, 2019, unit elections will be permitted in Scouts BSA, Venturing, and Sea Scout units. Boy Scout Troops may request a visitation to be scheduled at time. Scouts BSA Troops, Venturing Crews, and Sea Scout Ships may request a unit visitation now to be scheduled at any time after February 1.

The new Order of the Arrow membership requirements are as follows:

- 1. The Scout must be a registered member of the Boy Scouts of America.
- 2. The Scout must have experienced 15 nights of camping while registered with a troop, crew, or ship within the two years immediately prior to the election.
  - a. The 15 nights must include one, but no more than one, long-term camp consisting of at least five consecutive nights of overnight camping, approved and under the auspices and standards of the Boy Scouts of America. Only five nights of the long-term camp may be credited toward the 15-night camping requirement.
  - b. The balance of the camping (10 nights) must be overnight, weekend, or other short-term camps of, at most, three nights each. Ship nights may be counted as camping for Sea Scouts.
- At the time of their election, youth must hold the Scouts BSA First Class rank, the Venturing Discovery Award, or the Sea Scout Ordinary rank or higher.
- 4. At the time of their election, youth must have approval of the Scoutmaster, Crew Advisor, or Sea Scout Skipper.
- 5. At the time of their election, youth must be under the age of 21.

Adults (age 21 or older) who meet the camping requirements may be selected following nomination to and approval by the lodge adult selection committee; contact the Lodge Adviser for details: lodgeadviser@ohlone63.org.

# National OA Policy Changes: Membership and Regalia Usage

Beginning February 1, 2019, Boy Scout Troops will be rebranded as Scouts BSA and will open the membership to young women ages 11-17. Commensurate with this change, the Order of the Arrow will enable unit elections Scouts BSA as of that date. Moreover, we will also be welcoming youth from Venturing and Sea Scout units who have earned the Discovery or Ordinary awards, respectively. We will have great opportunity to learn from these new Candidates and we will have plenty to share with them, too. The most visible early change will be the female youth at Conclave in 2019.

Separately, there have been some changes in the use of Native American Indian regalia within the Order of the Arrow. The respectful use of these artifacts will continue to support the active Dance traditions and the internal Lodge ceremonies (Pre-Ordeal, Ordeal, Brotherhood, and Vigil). The updated guidelines from National state that the Lodge will no longer allow the use of the ceremonial regalia outside these Lodge events. There are, however, new scripts to support common situations where regalia has been used. Specifically, Cub Scout Arrow of Light and Crossover ceremonies have been piloted by Ohlone and are available for use within the Council.

Cheerful Service was plentiful, and both the camp the Brotherhood is stronger for it. Congratulations to the 37 new Ordeal and 2 new Brotherhood members who were inducted that weekend. Thanks again to Bob Marozine for providing a firm foundation and great food. We are on track to have another great Ordeal weekend later this month.

At the Banquet in June, four new Vigil candidates were called out: Jared Biesty, Owen Convery, Bryan Klech, and Deborah Quinn. All current Vigil members are invited to their Vigil breakfast during Fall Fellowship at Cutter Scout Reservation on November 10-11, 2018.

NOAC 2018 was a blast! Ohlone had 16 Arrowmen participating -- 11 youth, 3 adults, 3 staff, and 1 remote delegate. Some stories have been covered above; come to Ordeal and we'll tell you more.

There is change at the Section level, too. Last year, Ryan Tagawa was our Section Secretary; he has been succeeded by Owen Convery, who is focusing on section promotions for the 2019 Conclave and in general. Ryan is continuing in another, possibly larger role: the Site CVC for the upcoming Conclave. He will be supported by Chris Morrison as Site Adviser.

In the 2018-2019 year, Ohlone will be preparing to host Conclave in April, 2019 at Cutter Scout Reservation. This is the main focal point for the year and has impacted our planned service projects and our schedule. Both Ordeals will be at Cutter, along with two Fellowship/Service weekends and a final Conclave preparation weekend. We're making great progress, but it will be all hands on deck for the next 6 months. Please join us! As Allowat Sakima said in the Pre-Ordeal ceremony, "Friends, *those who chose you need you.*"

Camp Oljato has also had great support from the Ohlone Lodge this year. Connor Grason returned on staff and was the camp's OA lead in 2018. Chris Morrison kept the camp running as Camp Commissioner in 2018 and will return as Camp Director in 2019. Several Arrowmen are interested in Oljato staff for 2019, but there are always good roles to be filled with additional Arrowmen -- please contact Mr. Morrison (vciadviser@ohlone63.org) if you are interested in a summer of fun!

Lastly, we have another leadership change -- we've added a new role of Service Adviser, held by Casey Inman. The goals are to promote service opportunities for Arrowmen within the Council; the tactics involve a new calendar to consolidate event details, ongoing promotion at Chapter and Lodge events, and logistical coordination for these events. We'll be starting with the traditional Ohlone events: Memorial Day Flags, Trail to First Class, the Christmas Tree Lot, and Camporee. The Lodge also worked on an ad hoc effort to support the new

Sustainability project at Cutter by building new tent platforms in advance of the pilot Sustainability Camp in August.
